

Greetings from the President

Greetings fellow Dixie Barbershoppers.

I'm looking forward to a great weekend at our fall convention in Tunica, MS. If you have not registered yet, please go to the website, dixiedistrict.org, and do so quickly. The convention site is a great location, and a good time will be had by all.

Your District Board of Directors met in Atlanta a week ago and, despite a very tight budget, made plans for us for the coming year. I'm happy to report that no increases in dues or registration fees were passed by the board. This decision was based on expectations of your continued participation in all district sponsored events. Jim DeBusman reported that an excellent Dixie Lakeside Harmony Weekend (DLHW) was conducted in Huntsville with over 100 in attendance. Jim Moore also conducted a Youth In Harmony Explosion Camp with about as many young men in attendance. All the evaluations were very positive, and they both look forward to growing the numbers at next year's DLHW.

We have three potential chapters in our district. One in Clarksville, TN, one in Albany, GA, and one in Boston, GA. If your chapter is close to any of these sites, please contact them and offer assistance in their endeavors. District membership continues to drop a bit (about 18) due mainly to non-renewals of existing members. New members are being registered, particularly by those chapters participating in Operation Harold Hill. Please contact members who have not renewed and encourage them to

do so.

As you may know, we have been without an Executive Vice-president for 2012. The Board approved Dwain Chambers as interim EVP and he will also be nominated for the position for 2013. This must be approved by the House of Delegates (HOD) in Tunica. Speaking of the HOD meeting, be sure your chapter is represented by an official delegate at the meeting. It will be at 2:00pm on the Friday of the convention in Tunica.

Your VP for Events, Jack Donaldson, has been

Standing Ovation Program

Well, it's happened again. Summer vacations gone and more of the guys are showing up at rehearsal getting ready for District convention and competition. Perhaps, holiday music is being dusted off and Jingle Bells is being sung in preparation for Christmas performances. This might be a good time to request

an SOP review of your performance. It's educational, interesting, and most of the time it's painless.

Here's how it works.

The Dixie District Standing Ovation Program provides an opportunity for your chapter's chorus and quartets to be evaluated in their public performance presentations. This is a voluntary, confidential program. Results are not reported to the Society, any of its committees, or any other chapter. The evaluation is strictly between the chorus or quartet being evaluated and the trained reviewer.

Reviewers are trained to observe the overall performance of a chorus or quartet, identify performance strengths and weaknesses, make recommendations to improve the presentation, and suggest appropriate resource material that might be useful.

After receiving a request from a chapter chorus or quartet, a Standing Ovation Program reviewer is assigned and the visit is scheduled at a mutually convenient time. The cost to the chapter consists of two complimentary tickets to the performance and any hospitality they wish to provide; reviewer

travel expenses are reimbursed by the district. Contact me if you are interested in having an SOP review of your performance.

Would you like information on becoming an SOP reviewer? Send me an e-mail that includes:

While budget limitations are of concern, we will do everything possible to provide Standing Ovation Program services to your chapter's chorus and quartets, even if you've already had a review and would like a follow-up evaluation to check on your progress.

2012 Dixie District International **Chorus Prelims & Quartet Contest** Jim Sams, Contest and Judging

The 2012 Dixie District International Chorus Prelims & Quartet Championship Convention will be held in Tunica, MS on Sept 28-30 at the Gold Strike Casino Resort. There will be three contest sessions held during the weekend.

Session 1 - The District Quartet Contest (2 rounds), Senior Quartet Championship & Senior Prelims (1 round), and the Novice Championship will begin at approximately 7pm on Friday, Sept 30th. Session 2 - The Dixie District International Chorus Prelims will begin at approximately 11am Saturday, Sept 29th.

Session 3 - The District Quartet Finals will begin around 7PM on Saturday, September 30th.

In addition to picking our district representative to the International contest in Toronto, Canada in July 2013, we will award the Most Improved Chorus and the top three choruses in each of three Chorus Plateau awards. In addition to choosing our top five District quartets, we will crown the new Dixie Champion quartet, the newest Novice Quartet Champions, and our newest Senior Quartet Champion and our Senior Quartet representative to the 2013 Mid-Winter Convention in Orlando, FL. (Start times are subject to change depending on the number of competitor entries.) There will also be slots open for quartets and choruses who would like to perform for score and evaluation only! This will be an excellent opportunity for choruses and quartets (Novice, Senior, and Regular District quartets) who don't want to compete, to perform and see how they compare with the competitors along with receiving 1 hour coaching evaluations from the judges!

All entries must be received by midnight Friday, Sept 7, 2012. Note that this deadline for contest entries is now THREE weeks from the contest. We are using a DOUBLE panel this year as we used last year to minimize costs. Let me reiterate this announcement. All entries must be received by midnight Friday, Sept 7, 2012. Please pass this important message on to all of your competitors so no one will be left out in the cold.

Details of how to fill out the OFFICIAL CI-20 Contest entry form are cut and pasted below in this letter. If you need help entering your quartet or chorus, I will be more than happy to help you with it. I can be reached at the numbers and addresses listed below. Please do not delay processing your CJ-20. The sooner you get started the quicker I will be able to process your entries and get you into the contests.

Because a number of the choruses are requesting "singing" evaluations with our judges, we may once again have "limited" rooms available for these sessions. In order to make it fair to all of our competitors, I will be asking the choruses IN ORDER OF RECEIPT OF CJ-20 ENTRY FORMS what your preference will be until all of the rooms have been assigned. The remaining choruses will receive oral reports from the judges with opportunity for questions as we have done in the past. Again, your best chance of having a "singing" evaluation is to get your entry forms in to me at your earliest convenience.

For those choruses or quartets who need extra time in the draw for travel delays, late arrivals, or dual members performing in more than one chorus or quartet, I need to know in advance of the draw. Put a note on your CJ-20 or email/call me in advance of the draw! If, for whatever reason, you have to drop out of the contest AFTER sending your CJ-20, please let me know at the earliest possible time. This is very important to the judges and the flow of the contest cycles.

Please Note: All Chorus and Quartet competitors MUST be members in good standing (dues paid in full) with the Society, District, and the chapter(s) with which they are competing. AND ALL competitors MUST have a paid convention registration. Failure to comply with either of these requirements could result in disqualification and removal of the quartet/chorus from the Official Scoring Summary.

Let me hear from you SOON! There will be plenty of room for NEW quartets and choruses that have not competed or performed on the District stage in quite a while. I would love to see ALL of our chapters represented. I hope to see you there!



BHS Society Board Meeting Report

I certainly hope that many of you were able to attend the 2012 International Convention in Portland, Oregon. All of the contests, shows, and special events were exciting and most entertaining. And I can assure you that the Society Board of Directors had its hands full with the CEO search interviews/vote, two new board members to vote on for 2013, and numerous other pieces of business to attend to. Here are some of the highlights of two full days of activity.

Our CEO search team, made up of Chairman Shannon Elswick, Rick Asby, Bill Biffle, and John Miller, along with Interim CEO and Society Board President, Alan Lamson, did an outstanding job of helping narrow our search down to three candidates. The SBOD had the opportunity to interview these three men on Monday morning. We were all most impressed with the backgrounds and integrity of these men. In the end, we felt that Marty Monson was the man we had been searching for these many months. He is very energetic, always thinking

up new ideas, looking ahead, and excited about the challenge of heading up the Barbershop Harmony Society. We look forward to working with Marty in the coming months and are confident that positive change will be in store for our Society.

The SBOD is also happy to announce that **Gerry Borden** (EVG) and **David Calland** (JAD) were voted onto the Society Board for three year terms beginning January, 1, 2013. **Rick Ashford** and **Jim Sams** (yours truly) will complete service on the Board effective December 31 to make room for these fine men to contribute to the ongoing work of the Society.

Roger Lewis, Chairman of the 75th Anniversary Committee, reported on many of the events that will be taking place in Toronto, Canada in July 2013. Needless to say, it is an event none of us will want to miss! In addition, the Mid-Winter Convention being held in Orlando, FL in January 2013 may tout having the largest Youth Chorus Festival ever with upwards of THRTY choruses! If you have never seen one of these festivals you will definitely want to be there!

Pete Carentz and "Montana Jack" Fitzpatrick presented an impressive ongoing study of providing a complete barbershop track for introduction into our nation's home schooling programs! Can you even begin to imagine what the impact a program of this magnitude could potentially have on the future of our Society? We will continue to monitor this potential program and I'm sure you will be hearing much more about this in coming months!

We also heard a very rousing address from the moderator of our District Presidents, Mike Ott, about the ongoing goals of District Presidents and our Operations Teams. The DP's and the SBOD are working more closely now than ever before. Together we are looking forward to having CEO Marty Monson on board to help formulate ideas and solutions for chapter membership growth and even greater enjoyment of barbershop harmony throughout our Society. We have some very strong leadership within the DP Council and are looking forward to another great year!

The Board voted to extend the time frame for small chapters' (less than eight members) charter

revocation to a total of NINE MONTHS! This will give our districts a THREE MONTH period to try and prevent chapter suspension (loss of voting privileges and chorus competition) and an additional SIX MONTHS following suspension to assist small chapters in getting their numbers back to EIGHT or more to prevent charter revocation. The District Presidents and members of their Leadership Teams will be notified on a monthly basis as to where their Chapters in Distress are and give them adequate time to help these chapters recover, if at all possible. However, at the end of this NINE MONTH period, if numbers are not above eight, chapter revocation is automatic. So PLEASE begin working with your small chapters in hopes of helping to breathe new life into their programs.

The Society CFO, Heather Verble, and Society Treasurer, **Dwayne Cooper**, and Harmony Foundation International CEO, Clarke Caldwell, are unanimous in their feeling that the financial future of our Society is indeed healthy and moving forward to pay off debt and provide even more opportunities for reaching out to our youth and to provide continuing education, resources, and outstanding conventions for our members. The only thing they require to make these opportunities available is a money stream from membership growth, participation in conventions and schools, and increasing contributions to the President's Council, Founder's Club, and Ambassadors of Song. YOU can make a difference in the future of your Society with personal attention and involvement in these most important programs. Keep in mind that at this point in time less than 15% of the Society membership is signed up with any of these programs. That means that more than 85% are doing very little to ensure the future of this Society. Just ask yourself if you feel that the future of barbershop harmony is worth investing money in.

Another Task Force, the Global Strategy Task Force, has been reinstituted to work even more closely with our Affiliates around the world. There is much work to be done as we stretch our arms across the

oceans and around the globe to keep the whole world singing!

The Mixed Harmony Affiliate Task Force is thinking seriously about inviting mixed quartets and VLQ's to look into what the BHS might be able to do for them and possibly introduce another potential affiliate to our Society. We've only begun to uncover the potential of this exciting opportunity. Who knows what doors these mixed groups might open to promote growth, not only in our Society, but also in the accapella world around us.

The SCJC is continuing to work through plans to address the financial problems a few districts are having in putting on two contests a year to choose representative choruses and quartets for our International conventions. A number of ideas have been tossed around between committees and the days ahead will be most interesting as proposals and plans are put forward for our consideration.

The Society Aptify computer program is being upgraded and the additional opportunities of information streams and operations assistance at all levels of our Society will be increased to exponential levels. We have only begun to scratch the surface as to what this program can do for us. We will be looking for more advanced training for our IT personnel in coming months.

This is just a sampling of the many ongoing discussions and decisions that are being made by the Society Board in conjunction with our District Presidents and Operations Team. We are all excited about the future of the BHS and are looking forward to a very positive impact as we once again have a CEO in place to encourage, motivate and undergird our district and Society leadership. We hope to become even more focused on reaching out and working harder at the chapter level to retool and help undergird the foundation of our great Society....the health and welfare of our chapters.



Sept 25, 1949 – August 28, 2012 Fletcher, NC

Chuck Greene was a well-known former Dixie District member and Director with the Asheville NC Chapter, 1977 Dixie quartet Champion Male Order Music Company, and recent 2010 inductee into the DIX Hall Of Fame.

The following obituary was provided by his wife Beverly Greene.

Chuck Greene died on August 28 from complications of a brief illness. He spent the last 10 years working as a consultant, trainer, coach, turn-around strategist, pioneer and visionary leader in non-profit sector through his company, 21st & 7th LLC. He worked primarily with the Barbershop Harmony Society and its local chapters.

His "Compellingly Attractive Chapter Meeting" workshops given across North America have touched thousands of members of BHS, as well as Harmony Inc. and Sweet Adelines Int'l, and other non-profits – Kiwanis, Lions Club, mainstream churches and many more. The workshops have also proved valuable for college music professors and their Music Ed students, who recognize that his innovations are especially appealing to younger generations. Chuck's philosophy was this: "Seek, develop, use and enhance the skills and talents of each member to such an extent that progress seems limitless." His goal was to train leadership in intentional evolution of their organizations, allowing them to continually change, grow and thrive in the 21st century. His passion was sharing the stellar 4-part chords of barbershop harmony to everyone he could. His years as a member of BHS included attending 42 consecutive international conventions, including six years as an International Quartet Competitor with four different quartets.
