

Several successful one-day high school festivals have been held recently. Both the Marietta and Atlanta Metro Chapters recently sponsored *Real Men Sing* festivals in cooperation with **SAI** chorus **Song of Atlanta**. Also, the **Lake Lanier Chapter** has done several classroom visits to local high schools, as well as quartet coaching.

The 2015 Harmony Explosion Camp will be held July 16 - 19, in Chattanooga, TN. **Dusty Schleier** and **Clay** and **Becki Hine** will be the clinicians. The teaching quartet for the boys will be **The Academy**, 2014 College Quartet Champions. The teaching quartet for the girls is being selected. More information about this camp will be forthcoming soon. As you know, all educators to this camp are given full scholarships, and each singer pays only \$100 to attend all three days. Harmony Foundation and the Dixie District contribute to the costs of presenting the camp.

In 2015 the District will again award Harmony University music educator scholarships. This is a great way to make teachers aware of the benefits of introducing barbershop into their music programs. If you would like to nominate a music teacher for a 2015 District HU scholarship, send me a nomination letter, a copy of the teacher's resume, and a statement assuring that the teacher can attend. The 2015 Harmony University will be held July 26 thru August 2 in Nashville.

This convention will be held under ONE ROOF, with the Von Braun Center serving as our contest site. It will be very convenient for all attendees. We will have an International Quartet Prelim (2 rounds), a District Chorus Championship, and a Most Improved Chorus Award based on chorus scores from last spring. We will also offer a "Score for Evaluations Only" session for those choruses/quartets who do not wish to compete but would like to receive a personal score sheet and a 60-minute coaching session, or 45-minute evaluation session. We just need *you* there to participate!

As promised, the evaluations/coaching sessions following each contest session will be YOUR CHOICE. Here is the list of the sessions, along with the judging panel that will be on tap for our contest:

- 1) No Evaluation or Coaching
- 2) Evaluation Only-3 judges 15min each
- 3) Coaching-3 judges 20min each
- 4) Coaching-2 judges (SNG/PRS) 30min each
- 5) Coaching-2 judges (SNG/MUS) 30min each
- 6) Coaching-2 judges (MUS/PRS) 30min each
- 7) Your choice of judges (based on 1st come/ 1st served)

# **Dixie Loses Two Giants of Harmony**

#### **Charlie McCann**

Charles Phillip McCann, age 86 of Nashville, TN went home to be with the Lord on January 19, 2015.

Charles was born in Nashville, TN on November 7, 1928 to the late John & Hazel McCann and was raised on a farm in Brentwood. He attended David Lipscomb High School and graduated with honors from Vanderbilt University's School of Engineering in 1950. He began his career with McCann Steel Company, a family business, and later started his own engineering firm, Charles McCann and Associates. He retired as a structural engineer and closed his firm December 31, 2014.

Charlie had a passion for a cappella four part harmony and was a member of the Barbershop Harmony Society for more than fifty years. He served the organization at the local and district levels before being elected International President of the Society in 1990. Among the many honors Charlie has received are the Chapter Barbershopper of the Year award, the 1980 Dixie District BOTY award, and his 1997 induction into the Dixie District Hall of Fame. Over the years he sang in several registered quartets, including three district senior champions.

Charlie was preceded in death by his loving wife Jean Barrett McCann, daughter, Penelope Joyce (William) Waller, and sister, Dorothy McDonald.

Survivors include his soul mate Betty Shelton, daughter, Kathy (Robert Lee) Smith, sister, Carol

Burden, brother, John (Ruth) McCann, 6 grand children, 10 great grandchildren, and a host of nieces and nephews. The family received friends on Saturday, January 24, 2015 at Harpeth Hills Funeral Home where a celebration of Charlie's life was conducted on Sunday January 25. A Graveside service was held Monday, January 26, 2015 at Harpeth Hills Memory Gardens.

#### **Thom Hine**

**Thomas Joe Hine** died at Tranquility at Kennesaw Mountain on December 28, 2014, ending his 3 ½ year battle with cancer. He was peaceful and surrounded by his family. A memorial service for Thom was held on Saturday, January 3, 2014 at Alpharetta First United Methodist Church in Alpharetta, GA.

Thom was born on August 19, 1935 in Martinsville, Indiana to June and Marion Hine. At age 14 his high school shop teacher wanted to form a barbershop quartet, and the rest, as they say, is history. He quickly developed an incredible love of vocal harmony and barbershop singing that led him to lifelong friends, his wife, Carla, of 52 years, and a family connected by love and music. Thom was a 64-year member of the Barbershop Harmony Society (BHS), and tirelessly shared his passion and his talent for singing and for leadership with barbershop singers across the US and around the world. Thom graduated from Proviso Township High School (Maywood, IL), and received a Bachelor of Arts degree in Economics from Lake Forest University (Chicago, IL) in 1957, where he was a member of the Kappa Sigma fraternity. He served in the US Army and Illinois National Guard, achieving the rank of Specialist E-4. After college he worked at Goodyear Tire and Rubber Company, then was employed in various roles at Allstate Insurance Company for 33 years, retiring in 1993 to pursue his passion - barbershop harmony. Throughout his life he lived in many places, including Indiana, the Chicago area (a few times), Arkansas, North Carolina, Ohio, Michigan, and finally metro Atlanta, as director and then Director Emeritus of the Big Chicken Chorus, and then as a member of the Atlanta Vocal Project. Thom loved coaching and teaching barbershop harmony, and directed several choruses throughout his life. He sang in many quartets, including the popular Midnight Oilers, The Four Henchmen (11th place, International Barbershop Quartet Competition in 1982), The Atlanta Forum (Dixie District Quartet Champions with his son, Clay, in 1987), and The Old Kids on the Block (International Senior Quartet Champions in 1991). Thom was the 1996 Dixie District Barbershopper of the Year and was inducted into the Dixie Hall of Fame in 2004. Thom is survived by his loving wife, Carla Beyer Hine, his sisters Patricia Haskett (Carmel, IN) and Jean Morgan (Scottsdale, AZ), his sons, Clayton and Bradley Hine, their wives Becki and Georgia Hine, grandchildren Melody, Camden, and Kelso, and the thousands of people he made part of his extended family. We'll miss you Thom...but the bass section in heaven just got a whole lot better!
