RSVP: Full Contact Barbershop!

Full Contact Barbershop? It was 2011, and Joe Connelly stood in front of just 17 guys in a grueling coaching session. It was getting late, the guys were tired and beginning to make mistakes, when Joe uttered these words, words that continue to have a home at RSVP Hall. "Guys, shake it out, cause this ain't no kids game, it's FULL CONTACT BARBERSHOP BABY!" He clapped his hands and said, "Mighty awesome!" The guys found the energy to finish strong that night and the phrase stuck.

So yes, come to the Germantown, TN, RSVP Chapter and you may not only hear the term used but can feel the effects of full contact barbershop, a fast paced, high energy, 3 hour vocal session that doesn't stop when practice is over. "Over 2/3rds of our chorus comes to the weekly afterglow, says Robert Strong, Co-director of RSVP. That shows us that these guys aren't just here to sing, but that they have bought into and are living the ethos that makes up our name. Relationships, Singing, Variety



and Passion. "We have crafted our meetings to engage the singers and keep them focused, says Craig Brown, codirector. On any given night, we may cover anywhere from 5-10 songs, have two 15 minute sectionals and still find time for a short business meeting. It's fun, I like it and the pace doesn't grant time for the guys to lose focus"; and it's obviously paying off!! "We feel like we hold the title of busiest chorus in Dixie and quite possibly, the USA". Since its beginnings, the chorus has averaged over 25 gigs annually.

In the short time the chorus has been together, they have won the 2013 Dixie District Chorus Championship, and they were invited as wildcard competitors for the 2013 International Convention in Toronto, Ontario. Quite the achievement for a 24 man chorus. The chapter is also preparing to host its first chapter show on June 22nd and is hosting Dixie's own "A Mighty Wind". It's gonna be a great show for sure! We have an international wildcard chorus, an international wildcard quartet (Decades) and the current 3rd place quartet in the world, all under one

roof. Although Germantown is situated in the far west corner of the district, the chapter is within reasonable driving distance of at least 5 chapters. Make a day trip and come see us! www.rsvpchorus.com



Newest citizens welcomed barbershop style!

The newest recurring gig for the **Chattanooga Choo Choo Chorus** is singing the National Anthem and God Bless America for the Naturalization Ceremony for new US citizens. The swearing in ceremony is held in the US District Court located in Chattanooga, and we sit in the juror's box which means we need only a few singers since there are only twelve main seats and three alternate seats.

The ceremony is simple. We rise as the Judge enters, a Jr. ROTC color guard presents the US and state flags, we sing the National Anthem, the applicants are introduced and pledge their oath of allegiance, the Judge makes a stirring speech, we sing God Bless America, the colors are retired, and the court is adjourned. The Judge presents each new citizen with their Naturalization Certificate, posing with them and family for a photograph. More than 30 countries were represented

at during the recent morning and afternoon sessions. Between sessions, we go as a group to eat lunch.

What is not so simple is the reaction of those being sworn in to our singing. After our first sing out, the Judge told us how many of the applicants wiped tears from their eyes. And many of us swelled with emotion as we sang to them about our and their new country. There are more than one of us whose eyes are moist and whose voice breaks for a measure.


After the ceremony is time to greet and welcome the new citizens. They praise and thank us for our singing. One of our members asks to see their Naturalization Certificate, and you would not believe how much they beam as they proudly display the fruits of their labors. A moving day for ALL involved.
