Thursday, July 18 through Saturday July 20, 2013 at the University of Alabama, Huntsville, Alabama


Note! The only cost for a camper is a \$45 fee (\$50 if after July 1). Music Educators who attend will be granted a full scholarship. Please register early - registration includes:
