## 120 Young Men Attend 2017 "Real Men Sing"

The 2017 Real Men Sing event was conducted by the **Marietta**, **GA Chapter** of the Barbershop Harmony Society on Saturday, September 9 at the Marietta Performing Arts Center, with 120 young men and ten music educators from area schools in attendance.

Sponsors of this event included the Estate of Dean Olander, Big Chicken KFC, Atlanta Northeast Marriott, Marietta Performing Arts Center, Morrison Financial Group, the **Big Chicken Chorus**, Doug and Betsy Skaggs, and individual donors. The sponsorships provided the funding for the costs of venue rental, clinician and teaching quartet expenses, the acquisition of music and learning tracks, a KFC Dinner, a Real Men Sing wrist band, and a custom designed T-shirt that was worn as a uniform by the participants during the performance at the conclusion of the event. Participants paid a nominal registration fee of \$5 per participant.

The event was a one day vocal clinic conducted by Michael O'Neill, of Hendersonville, TN and Kevin Mendez of Antioch, TN, followed by a free concert which included all the clinic participants, the teaching quartets — The Simple Life and Pratt Street Power , and the Big Chicken Chorus. The purpose of the event was to encourage and promote the participation by young men in the vocal music programs in their respective schools. Clinic registrants included students from 14 schools in Carroll, Cobb, and Pickens counties and Marietta City Schools. Traffic congestion resulting from evacuations in advance of Hurricane Irma prevented some schools from participating.

The participants were separated into a Middle School Chorus and a High School Chorus, each of which was instructed in two songs plus two songs performed by both choruses in conjunction with the **Big Chicken Chorus**. Many members of the **Big Chicken Chorus** provided support for the execution of the event. Lars Grevstad provided musical leadership and guidance in preparation of the event. Administrative leadership for the day was provided by Jeff Hoffman, Frank Hrach, and about a dozen other members of the **Big Chicken Chorus**. More than 25 members of the **Big Chicken Chorus** performed on the show following the event.

The event received glowing reviews from the participants, Choral Directors and the audience in attendance for the 7 pm performance.

Plans are already in progress to prepare for Real Men Sing 2018, with the Music Educators in attendance volunteering their efforts to make the 2018 event bigger and better than ever.
